GRANTS TO TEACHERS & SCHOOLS

GEF granted \$141,770.76 to
GISD educators to fund projects
for the 2021–22 school year.
Teachers submitted applications
to GEF seeking support for
projects aimed to improve
student outcomes in the areas
of early literacy, high school
readiness, and
college/career/military
readiness.

In total, GEF accomplished its goal by providing grants to teachers and classrooms exceeding \$170,000. Our total support towards the Galveston Independent School District reached back up to our prepandemic levels at around \$230,000.



PROGRAMS & INITIATIVES

DISTRICT INITIATIVE

Each year, GEF collaborates with GISD to secure private funding for large-scale, district-wide initiatives that need financial support. These initiatives are identified by GISD leadership and approved by GEF's board of directors. Past projects include The Book Bus, water bottle filling stations, after school programs and BHS STEM labs.

1ST YEAR TEACHER ACADEMY

Provides training, mentoring, and resources to aid in the success of brand new teachers. GEF budgets for a \$10,000 a year investment in the program and provides gift cards for each new teacher to purchase supplies they need to get established.

JULIE SCHMID SUPPORT FUND

Created in honor of GEF's first executive director and materializes Julie's conviction that every child deserves hope and opportunity. The purpose of the fund is to support children in difficult circumstances that prevent them from participating in valuable educational experiences.

BHS STEM & BIO MED

Created in 2018 to support a growing community effort behind establishing a cell culture lab and synthetic cadaver at Ball High. GEF supports the program with a \$5,000 annual commitment. Educators who teach those labs also continue to apply for funding during our grants cycle.

After a Shark Tank style competition, the GEF awarded a total of \$51,000 in special anniversary grants at our 2022 Seaside Spring Soiree.

The grand prize of \$25,000 went to Crenshaw School of Environmental Studies for their green fitness trail.

\$15,000 went to Ball High School for a new recording studio for their media arts department (all materials will be transferred to the new building when complete).

Finally, \$11,000 was awarded to Morgan Magnet Elementary to enhance its robotics program.
